Due to the **CORONAVIRUS** (COVID-19) Unity Housing would like to ensure that all residents have some useful information with regards to the various Food Banks and support services within the Leeds area to help assist where possible.

Food Banks

Moortown Methodist Church (post Alderton Rise, phone 07542 189059) as well as Lister Hill Baptist Church (post 1 Brownberrie Ave, Horsforth, LS18 5PW, telephone 07758 196 951) provide free food in northern Leeds. The parcels may have pudding, coffee, nappies, and more. Both partner with Trussell Trust.

Foodbanks from churches in Eastern Leeds can help the vulnerable. There are several locations to try for a parcel. The distribution centres are St Richards Church on Ramshead Hill, Seacroft, LS14 1BX is open on Tuesdays as well as Church of the Epiphany, Gipton, LS9 6SW.

Health for All Cafe and its partner charities provides emergency food in southern Leeds. Volunteers pack boxes of food and collect perishable and canned goods from supermarkets and restaurants in West Yorkshire. There are several places to pick up a parcel, if the family has a voucher.

Drighlington Methodist Church on King Street is open on Monday from 2 – 4pm.

Middleton St Cross can provide a parcel on Tuesday from 10 am to 2pm. The location is 38 Acre Crescent, Middleton, LS10 4DJ. Another place on Tuesdays is Gildersome St Peters Church.

Hunslet Methodist Church. Post is Telford Terrace, Hunslet, Leeds, LS10 2HR can provide free food parcels on Wednesday from 10am – 12pm, and New Horizons Church as 32a Commercial St is open Wednesday pm.

In order to provide the most appropriate help for the circumstances of your situation we work with local agencies. If they feel you are struggling to put food on the table, they will issue you with a foodbank voucher. The local agency can also provide long term support if needed to help address some of the issues behind the reasons for your crisis. Agencies we work with include: Citizens Advice, housing support officers, children's centres, health visitors, social services and some local charities.

Our scheme is aimed to improve the quality of life of the service user by providing individual support when dealing with all aspects of housing issues.

This could be any of the following:-Disconnecting and reconnection of gas and electric. Completing housing related forms. Housing Benefits. Council Tax benefit. Accompanying service-user to appointments that are housing related. Referrals can be carried out via a telephone conversation; through an agency; from a friend or family member or, it could be a self referral.
